

# Following the lead of the Moravian Brethren who began having "watch" services in 1733, John Wesley,

created watch night services, sometimes calling them Covenant Renewal Services. They would typically happen on New Year's Eve to give people an opportunity to look back over the past year, confessing their sins, remembering God's blessings and renewing their commitment to Christ for the new year. Typical services often included prayer, scripture, song, proclamation, and sometimes a Moravian Love Feast, but always included a time of personal covenant. The Wesley Covenant Prayer is a practical description of what Jesus was talking about when he said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23).

> "I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

### Leisure Ministries

As you know, our programming at Bethany UMC has been limited since the COVID-19 Pandemic. Due to the high level of virus activity in the local area that continued to exist we continued to delay, postpone and ultimately cancel a number of important programs

We would like to announce that we are planning to restart leisure ministry programs on Monday, January 4, 2021. Please understand that should conditions change, we may be forced to reconsider re-starting to protect the health of our children, staff and families. We will continue to monitor our local public and private schools and follow state and federal advisories as we move forward.

With the re-starting of our programs, we have developed protocols based on guide-lines from The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control. It is imperative that all parents, children and staff abide by these protocols to protect the health of all children and staff and their families. Adherence to the requirements is not optional and failure to do so may jeopardize your child's status within our programs. We have prepared a waiver of liability for each participating family to sign as a requirement for restarting the program. And that will be sent to you digitally in the near future.

One of the biggest changes to Bethany Ball this season will be the limitations that will be in place in terms of parents and fans attending games and practices. There will be NO spectators allowed in the gym during games or practices to begin the season. We will be finalizing drop-off and pick up protocols and will share them with you all in the next week or so. These protocols have been created in conjunction with DHEC, and will mirror efforts being taken around the state to safely allow for children to get back playing sports. I know for many, Saturdays at Bethany have become an interictal part of your winter schedule and we will certainly miss you all, however we believe controlling our environment gives us the best opportunity to have a safe and successful season.

The skills assessments will be held starting on Monday January 4th and during that week. Practices begin on Monday January 11th, and our 1st games will be on Saturday January 16th.

This decision to restart these ministries brings an excitement to our staff and our church that has been missing since last spring. We miss seeing your children in and around the gym. After many hours of prayer and consideration, we are confident that we can re-open safely and we ask that you continue to support us with your prayers as we march forward.














### Missions
